## Dear Lilienthal Community,

As you know, one of the many things that make Claire Lilienthal such a wonderfully diverse community is its Korean Immersion Program. With Chuseok right around the corner (this Friday), I wanted to spend a little time shining a light on this portion of our school.

The KIP program runs from Kindergarten through 8<sup>th</sup> grade here at Lilienthal and is the only Korean immersion school in Northern California. Although originally only Kindergarten through 5<sup>th</sup> grade, the program has been expanded to 8<sup>th</sup> grade within the last five years. In total, we enroll between 160-170 Korean Immersion students at a time. They come from all corners of the city and the students have a wide range of Korean spoken at home. For some of our students, school is the only time these students will speak Korean.

At Kindergarten we enroll 22 students and at times, we have students join our program at higher grade levels. However, in order to join the KIP program after Kindergarten, a student must display grade level appropriate Korean skills so they can keep pace with the Korean Language curriculum. In the younger grades, there is more Korean than English spoken over the course of the day. This ratio makes it close to 50/50 in 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade and then makes a transition in Middle School. By the time our KIP students are in Middle School, they have two periods a day (Math and Enrichment) spoken in Korean. The remaining periods of the day, students are integrated into our general education program. For instance, a 7<sup>th</sup>-grade KIP student will take PE, Language Arts, Social Studies, and Science in English with their general education peers.
